THE COURT: Okay.

MR. PATTERSON: Returning the matter to an  
assignment court. I've spoken with Mr. Cassista  
he's looking for a date in March. We've settled on  
a date of March, March 22<sup>nd</sup>, with the  
acknowledgment....

THE COURT: March 22<sup>nd</sup>.

MR. PATTERSON: March 22<sup>nd</sup>, it's an assignment court, Your Worship, in M1 at 9 a.m. with the acknowledgement that the delay from this period forward to that day will be the responsibility of the defence.

THE COURT: Is that for trial on March the....

MR. PATTERSON: Just to be spoken to, Your Worship. I don't believe that Mr. Cassista is looking for a trial date on that particular day, are you, sir?

MR. CASSISTA: Well, that was the trial date, wasn't it originally?

THE COURT: Oh, you're looking for a trial date, sir?

MR. CASSISTA: Well what were the--what originally was it for?

MR. PATTERSON: We had some brief discussions, Your Worship. If I might just have the court's indulgence?

THE COURT: Sure.

MR. PATTERSON: If you're looking for a trial date, sir, we can certainly set that now, is that what you're asking?

MR. CASSISTA: I guess before it was originally to, do what?

MR. PATTERSON: It's marked to be spoken to today, sir. It's for you to decide what you'd like to do with the charge...

MR. CASSISTA: Oh.

MR. PATTERSON: ...you can resolve the matter today or you can set a date for trial or you can have some additional time as you've indicated.

MR. CASSISTA: Okay, we'll set a trial.



MR. PATTERSON: Okay. Court's indulgence, Your  
Worship.

THE COURT: Okay.

MR. PATTERSON: I believe our first available dates  
are in August, are they not?

CLERK OF THE COURT: I have a few in July. I have  
one in June.

MR. PATTERSON: I have June 29<sup>th</sup>, does that happen  
to be....

THE CLERK OF THE COURT: I have June 22<sup>nd</sup>.

MR. PATTERSON: Not available to the officer.

THE CLERK OF THE COURT: July 20<sup>th</sup>.

MR. PATTERSON: July 20<sup>th</sup> is available for the  
officer.

THE CLERK OF THE COURT: July 20<sup>th</sup>, Your Worship, M2  
at ten thirty.

THE COURT: And that's two naught?

THE CLERK OF THE COURT: I'm sorry?

THE COURT: Is that July 20, two naught?

CLERK OF THE COURT: Two zero.

THE COURT: Yes. At what time?

THE CLERK OF THE COURT: Ten thirty.

THE COURT: All right, so the matter against Shawn  
Cassista will be adjourned to July the 20<sup>th</sup>, 2011,  
in courtroom M2 for trial.

MR. PATTERSON: Thank you, Your Worship. Thank  
you, sir.
